You can make it up if you like- try to be creative and use your imagination!	Go for a walk and use your senses to describe God's creation. Share your experiences with your family and write them down.	Design a holiday brochure for any country in Africa. Include facts and pictures. Why would it be a great place to visit?
Write a short story that contains ALL 15 words from your spelling list! How interesting can you make it?	Can you find a substance that won't freeze? How about one that won't change to a solid?	Measure amounts carefully to make a fruit smoothie using exotic fruits. Write instructions on how to make it, and if possible, take some photos to share with the class!	Ask someone to create some fractions for you to add together. Remember, the denominators need to be the same!
Imagine you have won a prize to visit Africa. Which country would you visit and why?	Choose 4 four-digit numbers. Use the column addition method to add together each pair. What is the largest total you can make?	Write a journal about your weekend. Try to make it as interesting as possible!	On A4 paper, create a collage of a flag of an African country.
Have a go at making ice cream. How did you do it? Write down each step and if possible, take some photos!	Create a model/picture of an African landscape (desert, savannah, mountains, coasts). You can use whichever materials you like.	Write a poem about Baptism. Remember to include what you have learned from R.E lessons and liturgies.	Write a book review about your favourite book. Why is it your favourite book? Include details about the story and the author.
Find a black and white map of Africa and colour it in, thinking carefully about what colours the land and coasts should be.	Research a famous scientific investigation about changing materials and explain the results.	Make a list of the first 10 PRIME numbers. Use your times tables and knowledge of factors to prove that the numbers in between are NOT PRIME.	Research how many countries there are in Africa. What are their capital cities?
